

Key facts about pupil learning, teaching and school management in **Bonthe District**




This factsheet is based on findings from the Secondary Grade Learning Assessment (2018).

Fact 1

In Bonthe, learning levels of JSS2 and SSS2 pupils are low in both English and Mathematics.






Average learning levels in Bonthe are lower than the national average


Fact 2 In Bonthe, learning levels of girls are lower than that of boys. Pupils that show only up to P6 level skills in English JSS2 pupils 2 or more years behind SSS2 pupils 5 or more years behind **Girls** 65% SSS2 girls' skills are more **limited** to lower grades (P6 or below) than boys 58% Boys 48% **Gender-based** differences are much larger in Bonthe than at the national level

Fact 3

At JSS2 level, the learning of wealthy and poor pupils are similar in Bonthe. However, wealthier SSS2 pupils perform better than those from poorer households.

Show only up to P6 level skills in English 5 or more years behind

In Bonthe, where wealth-based differences exist in favour of richer pupils (SSS2 English and JSS2 Math), they are larger than national level

Fact 4

In Bonthe, a small percentage of JSS and SSS teachers are female. Most teacher characteristics in Bonthe are similar to the national average statistics.

Fact 7

92% of JSS teachers now use printed MBSSE lesson plans in Bonthe. However, 48% of these teachers find it difficult to link learning objectives to the appropriate grade level.



9 in every 10 JSS teachers use printed MBSSE lesson plans in Bonthe

5 out of 10 JSS teachers that use lesson plans in Bonthe are unable to link learning objectives to the appropriate grade level



In Bonthe, a larger fraction (5 in 10) of teachers make the right links, than at the national level, where only 4 in 10 teachers are able to do so

Fact 6

A typical JSS school in Bonthe has 18 pupils per teacher. The pupil-teacher ratio is higher in SSS schools

JSS pupil teacher ratio




SSS pupil teacher ratio

All schools in Bonthe have parent-teacher or community-teacher associations. Most of these bodies are active, having met at-least once in the current or previous term.
