

Key facts about pupil learning, teaching and school management in **Port Loko District**




This factsheet is based on findings from the Secondary Grade Learning Assessment (2018).

Fact 1

In Port Loko, learning levels of JSS2 and SSS2 pupils are low in both English and Mathematics.





Average learning levels in Porto Loko are similar to the national average

In Port Loko, learning levels of girls are lower than that of boys.

Pupils that show only up to P6 level skills in English

JSS2 pupils 2 or more years behind

SSS2 pupils 5 or more years behind


SSS2 girls' skills are more limited to lower grades (P6 or below) than boys



Gender-based differences are larger in Porto Loko than at the national level

Fact 3

JSS2 pupils from wealthier households perform better in English than pupils from poorer households in Port Loko. However, SSS2 pupils from poorer households score higher in English.





Show only up to P6 level skills in English 2 or more years behind



Show only up to P6 level skills in English 5 or more years behind

Wealth-based differences at SSS2 level are more favourable to poorer pupils in Port Loko than at the national level. The opposite is true at JSS2 level

Fact 4

In Port Loko, a small percentage of JSS and SSS teachers are female. Most teacher characteristics in Port Loko are similar to the national average statistics.

Fact 7

90% of JSS teachers now use printed MBSSE lesson plans in Port Loko. However, 62% of these teachers find it difficult to link learning objectives to the appropriate grade level.



9 in every 10 JSS teachers use printed MBSSE lesson plans in Port Loko 6 out of 10 JSS teachers that use lesson plans in Port Loko are unable to link

learning objectives to the appropriate grade level



In Port Loko, a similar fraction of teachers make the right links, than at the national level, where only 4 in 10 teachers are able to do so

Fact 6

A typical JSS school in Port Loko has 16 pupils per teacher. The pupil-teacher ratio is higher in SSS schools.

JSS pupil teacher ratio




SSS pupil teacher ratio

While the JSS2 PTR ratio is lower in Port Loko than at the national level, the SSS2 PTR ratio is comparatively higher. Lesson observations in Port Loko compare similarly to the national level

Fact 8

Nearly all schools have parent-teacher or community-teacher associations in Port Loko. Most of these bodies are active, having met at-least in the current or previous term.
